

## **TERMS OF REFERENCE**

### **Aviation Special Interest Group (A/SIG)**

3 December 2010

A/SIG has interests in fire protection and fire safety systems for the aviation industry.

While currently inactive, FPA Australia wishes to revive a SIG to contribute to aviation safety and related standards, codes and regulations, e.g. the A/SIG was actively involved in the creation of the FPA Australia's Good Practice Guideline based on NFPA 415: Standard on Airport Terminal Buildings, Fueling Ramp Drainage, and Loading Walkways.

#### **Key Functions:**

- Keep abreast of legislation, regulations, codes, Australian Standards, and other publications that relate to fire protection in the aviation industry.
- Provide guidance on technical and application matters related to fire protection in the aviation industry to FPA Australia, TACs and SIGs.
- Review FPA Australia's relevant educational material and recommend the development of supporting documents (e.g. a data sheet) when the need is identified.
- Assist with the preparation of articles for publications such as FireTalk and the Fire Australia Journal on matters relating to fire protection in the aviation industry.
- Report to NTAC on key issues, recommendations, and request advice.

#### **Secondary Roles:**

- Provide a source of aviation fire safety information to FPA Australia members.
- Provide a forum for bring members with aviation fire safety interest.
- Work cooperatively with relevant external groups.
- Provide information about seminars and conferences relative to the industry, which should be considered by the Board.
- Run seminars or workshops on subjects of interest to FPA Australia members.
